



Every year on June 21, the world comes together to celebrate International Yoga Day, a day dedicated to the ancient practice that promotes physical, mental, and spiritual well-being.



Handloom Day:





Lastly conducting Handwashing program among the staffs and students .




Blood Donation Camp



Objectives of the CLC:

1. **Bridge the Learning Gap:** Many children, especially in remote areas, have limited access to quality education. CLCs aim to bridge the learning loss by providing remedial education and basic literacy and numeracy support.
2. **Enhance Foundational Skills:** Through interactive methods, storytelling, games, and hands-on activities, the CLC helps children strengthen their foundational learning, communication, critical thinking, and creativity.
3. **Encourage Community Participation:** Parents, youth volunteers, and retired teachers are encouraged to participate actively, creating a community-led educational ecosystem that ensures collective responsibility.
4. **Support School Readiness:** CLCs prepare out-of-school children and dropouts to be mainstreamed into formal education systems.
5. **Promote Life Skills and Awareness:** Apart from academics, children are sensitized about health, hygiene, gender equality, environment, and child rights through regular sessions and activities.

Key Features of CHANDRAMA's CLCs:

- Flexible Timing to accommodate children's household and work responsibilities.
- Locally Hired Educators who understand the community context and language.
- Low-Cost and Locally Available Learning Materials like charts, storybooks, and puzzles.
- Weekly Assessments and Progress Tracking for personalized support.
- Celebration of Local Culture and Festivals to make learning relatable and joyful.
